Community Against Violence (CAV) has continued strong partnerships with you, our northern New Mexico communities, Because of this, we have been able to provide emergency services, shelter, counseling, and housing to survivors of domestic and sexual violence, child and elder abuse, and human trafficking, and prevention programming even through this pandemic. We are proud to share what your financial donations and support have made possible!

Last year, CAV services reached 2,650 people. This includes 796 people who received free and confidential direct services.







Transitional Housing Report

CAV's award winning Transitional Housing Program provides subsidized housing for up to 24 months to individuals and families leaving emergency shelter or unsafe living situations. Based on the unique needs of each household, the program tailors support and resources for participants to develop stability and skills to live safely and independently again. CAV provided a total of:

- 6,072 housing nights in off-site leased transitional housing units to 13 adults and 13 children.

CAV's shelter provides a safe place for survivors and their families who are fleeing from domestic and sexual violence. Last year the shelter provided:

 1,720 shelter nights to 32 adults and 9 children



Advocacy & Counseling Programs

Advocates and counselors provide crisis intervention, case management, therapy, and advocacy and support for survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, and child abuse. Last year, CAV advocates and therapists provided:

- 3,747 hours of advocacy to 717 adults, child, and elderly survivors and
- 1.920 hours of individual counseling. to 108 survivors.



Northern New Mexico Children's Advocacy Center (CAC)

NM's first nationally-accredited forensic interview and specialized children's advocacy program, the Northern New Mexico Children's Advocacy Center (CAC) is in its 27th year of providing services to children (and adults with special needs) in cases where abuse is alleged or suspected. The CAC serves Taos, Colfax, Union, Rio Amba, Mora, San Miguel, and Guadalupe counties, and the northern Pueblos. Last fiscal year, the CAC handled:

Program

In partnership with Holy Cross Medical Center, CAV provided compassionate free medical care to 12 survivors of sexual assault. through the Taos Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) Program.

CAV Prevention, Outreach, & Education

Our Prevention, Outreach, & Education team works to educate and engage the entire community in preventing domestic and sexual violence of children and adults. Their job is to raise awareness through in-school facilitation, business training, community events, and media awareness on how to stop violence before it happens. Last year, the prevention program:

- Reached 892 students in 45 classrooms and 57 community members in 8 organizations.
- Organized and participated in 12 community events reaching 2.080 people.
- Worked with 70 participants in the CAV's CHANGES program and 9 participants in the Women Who Use Force Group, a 52-week, state-certified intervention program for people using power and control tactics in their interpersonal relationships.
