## Since 1978...

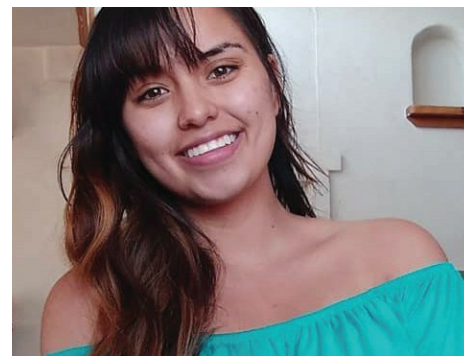
Community Against Violence (CAV) has continued strong partnerships with you, our northern New Mexico communities. Because of this, we have been able to provide emergency services, shelter, counseling, and housing to survivors of domestic and sexual violence, child and elder abuse, and human trafficking – even through this pandemic. We are proud to share what your financial donations and support have made possible!

Last year, CAV services reached 1,765 people. This includes 892 people who received free and confidential direct services.

## Transitional Housing Report

CAV's award winning Transitional Housing Program provides **subsidized housing for up to 24 months to individuals and families leaving emergency shelter or unsafe living situations.** Based on the unique needs of each household, the program tailors support and resources for participants to develop stability and skills to live safely and independently again.

**CAV provided a total of 6,004 housing nights in off-site leased transitional housing units to 14 adults and 14 children. Currently, a total of 8 adults and 13 children in 8 households are receiving transitional housing services.**



## CAV Clients Share Their Stories:

*"After the police came, I called the Santa Fe DV Shelter first because I wanted to get far away from him. But Santa Fe said they were full and told me to call Española. But Española also said NO and told me to call the Taos CAV. The lady on your hotline was very reassuring [which I desperately needed], and said they would find a safe place for me somewhere, Thank God! When a woman is threatened and has nowhere to turn, that voice-of-hope you offered is like a life-preserver thrown to a drowning victim!"*

## CAV Prevention, Outreach and Education

Our Prevention, Outreach, and Education team works to educate and engage the entire community in preventing domestic and sexual violence of children and adults. Their job is to raise awareness through educational presentations, business training, community events, and media awareness on how to stop violence before it happens. Last year, the prevention program:

- Reached 370 students in 85 classrooms and 185 community members in 11 organizations.

- Organized and participated in 4 community events reaching 485 people.

- Worked with 44 participants in CAV's "CHANGES" program, a 52-week, state-certified intervention program for people using power and control tactics in their interpersonal relationships.

**Shelter Services**

CAV's shelter provides a safe place for survivors and their families who are fleeing from domestic and sexual violence. Last year the shelter provided:

• 1,279 shelter nights to 42 adults and 23 children

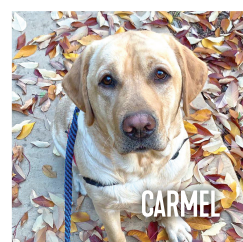
**Advocacy & Counseling Programs**

Advocates and counselors provide crisis intervention, case management, therapy, and advocacy and support for survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, and child abuse.

• Last year, CAV advocates and therapists provided 4,865 hours of advocacy to 892 adult, child, and elderly survivors and 1,468 hours of individual counseling to 102 survivors.

**Northern New Mexico Children's Advocacy Center (CAC)**

New Mexico's first nationally-accredited forensic interview and specialized advocacy program, the Northern New Mexico Children's Advocacy Center (CAC) is in its 25th year of providing forensic interviews and support services to children (and adults with disabilities) in cases where abuse is alleged or suspected. The CAC serves residents of Taos, Colfax, Union, Rio Arriba, Mora, San Miguel, and Guadalupe counties and the northern Pueblos. Last fiscal year, the CAC handled 274 cases.
