

TRANSITIONAL HOUSING

CAV's transitional housing program is designed to meet the needs of the community and to address the growing demand for housing opportunities for the individuals and families we serve.

CAV is proud of this award-winning program and the ways it has grown over the past years. CAV's Transitional Housing Program provides subsidized housing for up to 15 households for up to 24-months. Based on the unique needs of each household, this program tailors support and resources for participants to develop stability and skills to live independently in their own

The program allows for an essential "next step" for families leaving emergency shelter or unsafe homes. Since the beginning of the off-site leased transitional housing, CAV has housed 16 households, and is currently housing 10 households of 10 adults and 12 children.

Three CAV Transitional Housing Program participants shared how their families found hope and grew stronger:

I felt alone and like I didn't have anyone who could help me. I didn't think things could change and I thought things were bad because it was my fault. The support I received in the CAV's transitional housing program has helped me see that I am not to blame for the abuse in my home and that things can get better, I feel hopeful about my future and the life I am building."

"CAN's transitional housing program gave me and my child the opportunity and time to feel like we can make our own decisions about our lives,"

"While I was in the CAV transitional housing program, I had to change jobs to support my children, which meant I wasn't working for a month. Without this program we would have been back on the streets, but with it, I was able to make a decision that benefitted my family and we are better for it today."





24-Hour Crisis Hotline 575-758-9888

CAV's hotline is available 24-hours a day for help and information. 3,911 calls were handled by the hotline last year.



Advocacy & Counseling Programs

CAV advocates and counselors provide crisis intervention, case management, therapy, advocacy and support for survivors of domestic and sexual violence. In the last year:

- . CAV advocates provided 5,671 hours of services to 580 adult, child and elderly survivors
- · CAV therapists offered 367 hours of individual counseling to 64 survivors and 138 hours of group counseling to 28 client survivors



Shelter Services

CAV's shelter provides a safe place for clients and their families who are fleeing from domestic and sexual violence. Last year the shelter provided:

- . 2,667 shelter nights for 84 adults (28 adults with families and individuals without
- . 2,435 shelter nights for 48 child victims
- . 449 shelter nights to 13 adults and children who were homeless or victims of other violent crimes



Northern New Mexico Children's Advocacy Center

P New Mexico's first nationally accredited forensic interview and specialized advocacy program, the Northern New Mexico Children's Advocacy Center (NNMCAC) is a part of Community Against Violence. It is the only crisis-response agency for victims/survivors of domestic and sexual violence and child abuse and neglect in Taos County. NNMCAC also serves residents of Colfax, Union, Rio Arriba, Mora, San Miguel and Guadalupe counties and the northern Pueblos. Last year, NNMCAC handled 190 cases.

CAV PREVENTION

Our Prevention, Outreach, and Education team works to educate and engage the entire community in preventing domestic and sexual violence. Their job is to raise awareness of how to stop violence before it happens in our schools, churches, businesses, and families through educational presentations, business training, community events, and media awareness.

Last year, the Prevention program spent 704 hours working with 22 participants in CAV's Batterer's Intervention Programs.

The Prevention program provided educational services including:

- · Providing 9 outreach presentations to 483 people
- · Organizing and participating in 49 community events
- Reaching 3,319 students through primary prevention programs throughout Taos County and Taos Pueblo schools
- . Teaching the Vecinos program to businesses and organizations to enhance safety at their location for both youth and staff

When you make a purchase at CAV's Thrift Store, you help provide funding to local women, children, and men for clothing and personal items they were forced to leave behind in an emergency. Your donated items might help start new households as blankets for beds to sleep in, pots and pans to cook with, toys and teddy bears to hug, or clothes for those who are not able to pack a bad.

Or your donations may go directly to a sunvivor out of the Thrift Store Gift Certificate Program. In 2015, 415 people in need were given a total of \$20,757 in gift certificates. This number jumped in 2016 to 634 people in need given a total of \$29,066 in gift certificates. CAV Thrift Store also provided \$1,800 in vouchers to St. James Episcopal Church, Taos Men's Shelter, and the Shared Table at El Pueblito United Methodist Church.
