# For 41 years,

Community Against Violence (CAV) has provided northern New Mexico communities with emergency services, shelter, counseling, and housing to survivors of domestic and sexual violence, and child and elder abuse. A major reason CAV has been successful is the financial donations and dedicated volunteer support from our community members. Thanks to this, CAV provided

838 people with confidential and free services this last fiscal year.

#### TRANSITIONAL HOUSING REPORT

CAV's award winning Transitional Housing Program provides subsidized housing for up to 24 months to individuals and families leaving emergency shelter or unsafe living situations. Based on the unique needs of each household, the program tailors support and resources for participants to develop stability and skills to live safely and independently again.

Since expanding the program to off-site leased housing, CAV has housed 27 households, and is currently housing 8 households of 7 adults and 12 children. This year we intend to add an additional 4 houses to the program.

## PAST CAV TRANSITIONAL HOUSING PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS SHARF THEIR STORIES:

"It's hard to believe that just a few months ago I was in shelter, had no job and was severely depressed. Now my child and I live in a safe, warm and peaceful home, I have a job and I am feeling like I have an incredible future in front of me. This transformation in my life is all due to the wonderful staff at CAV."

## SHELTER SERVICES

CAV's shelter provides a safe place for survivors and their families who are fleeing from domestic and sexual violence. Last year the shelter provided:

- 2,427 shelter nights for 98 adults
- 2, 577 shelter nights for 54 child victims




Advocates and counselors provide crisis intervention, case management, therapy, and advocacy and support for survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault. and child ahuse

- 7,193 hours of services to 658 adult. child, and elderly survivors
- 948 hours of individual counseling to 117 survivors; 434 hours of group counseling to 57 survivors



New Mexico's first nationally-accredited forensic interview and specialized advocacy program, the Northern New Mexico Children's Advocacy Center

**(CAC)** is in its 22nd year of providing forensic interviews and support services to children (and adults with disabilities) in cases of abuse and neglect. The CAC serves residents of Taos, Colfax, Union, Rio Arriba, Mora, San Miguel, and Guadalupe counties, and the northern Pueblos. Last fiscal year, the CAC handled 238 cases.



## MEET THE CAV **SERVICE DOGS!**

## CAV PREVENTION, OUTREACH AND **EDUCATION**

Our Prevention, Outreach, and Education team works to educate and engage the entire community in preventing domestic and sexual violence of children and adults. Their iob is to raise awareness through educational presentations, business training, community events, and media awareness on how to stop violence before it happens. Last year, the prevention program:

- Reached 865 students through 162 classes and community outreach programs including 6 community organizations, businesses, and schools to enhance safety at their location for both youth and employees
- Organized and participated in 7 community events reaching 1,170 people
- Worked with 24 participants in CAV's "CHANGES" program, a 52-week, state-certified domestic violence offenders intervention program
