Our Prevention, Outreach and Education team works to educate & engage the entire community in ending domestic and sexual violence. Their job is to raise awareness of how to prevent violence in our schools, churches, businesses and families through educational presentations.

spent an average of 137 hours/month with 26 participants working in CAV's Batterer's Intervention Programs. The Prevention program also provided
